 The Academic Committee holds regular meetings with the Faculty members to discuss about the academic progress of the students. The teachers prepare lesson plans according to the class routine and execute the same.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- a) At the beginning of the academic session the Academic Calendar and the Annual Departmental Activity Calendar is prepared.
- b) The teaching plan is strictly followed and the class diary is maintained.
- c) Unit Tests, Class Tests, Sessional Examinations and Group Discussions etc. are conducted timely.
- d) Educational trips, Excursions and Field studies are conducted to expose the students for outdoor learning.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- a) The Examination schedules are followed according to the Prospectus as well as by periodic notices.
- b) After the completion of the units/topics, unit tests are conducted.
- c) Extra classes are arranged departmentally for smooth completion of the syllabus.
- d) After completion of the theory examination, answer scripts are assessed by following the prescribed rules of the university.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- a) From this academic session a Research and Development cell has been formed by the IQAC to motivate teachers to take up Minor and Major Research projects and to organise Seminars and Workshops.
- b) The IQAC encourages teachers to improve their API scores through participation in various conferences, workshops, seminars and also through publishing various articles, books and research findings.
- c) The IQAC supports teachers to avail study leaves under the UGC.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library: There is a reasonable collection of text books, reference books and journals covering a wide range of subjects in the College Library. Besides, magazines and newspapers are subscribed regularly. In the reading Room, attached to the Library, reference books, magazines and newspapers can be consulted. Every student is issued a library card against which he/she can borrow books. A Digital Photostat machine is also available for the students. The Library has access to many online journals and is connected to N-LIST Library facilities supported by the DONER ministry of India.

ICT: The requirements for virtual Classrooms has been procured. At present there are three Digital Classrooms in the College. Moreover the College Conference Hall has all the required gadgets for full fledged ICT presentations. Internet access is available for the benefit of the students, teachers and staff of the college.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The college considers the students to be the prime Human Resource and hence strives to develop them through a variety of activities initiated through NSS, NCC, Social and Cultural activities.
- b) The teachers enrich themselves through Refresher Course, Seminar etc.
- c) The College Governing Body works as an important agency to manage and develop the total human resource of the College.
- d) The College has an elected body of Students Union that also caters to the needs of human resource development.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

 The recruitment of the teaching and non -teaching staff is done strictly by following the Rules and Regulations laid by the Government, Parent University, and UGC. The recruitment of the temporary teaching and nonteaching staff is done through the Governing Body.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

 As of now, no Interaction or Collaboration with the industries has been made possible. But the college hopes to do so in the near future.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

 An Admission Committee is formed every year with a Senior teacher as Convener and the Principal as Chairman and with other teaching and nonteaching members, to conduct the admission process smoothly and in a free and fair manner. Students are also counselled for proper subject selection. All Govt. Norms in the matters of admission like reservations and merit are strictly followed.
