### **BEHIND THE CURTAIN: A NOTE ABOUT THE COLLEGE**

Established in 1981, SARAIGHAT COLLEGE is the only institution of Higher Education in greater Changsari area. During its more than three decades old journey, this institution has been striving untiringly to spread the ray of learning and education amongst the rural population that surrounds it. In this relentless service to the people, Saraighat College has so far experienced various hazards and challenges and successfully overcome the same.

From its very inception this institution has been working with a missionary zeal and laid great stress to educate students of socio economically marginalized condition and took special care to enroll girls in it.

With 116 students and a small contingent of 8 teachers along with 2 non teaching staff this institution came into operation on 21st July, 1981. Initially, it was only an institution of intermediary Arts-Courses. With the advancement of time, due to laborious philantropic activities of the founding teaching and non teaching staff and the enthusiastic cooperation of some local personalities, this institution became a full fledge Arts College. The college was brought under the 'Deficit Grant-in-Aid' system and the 'Government Provincialized' status on 25th March, 1998 and 13th April, 2009 respectively. The University Grant Commission (UGC), New Delhi, on 24th October, 2008 accepted its registration under the '2 (F) Category' and on 13th April, 2009 accepted the registration of this college under the '12-B' Category. The college was accredited by NAAC in 2004.

It is on the right side of the Jalukbari-Baihata Chariali connecting National-Highway. The Changsari Train station is just adjacent to the Saraighat College.



### **Admission Procedure:**

### 1. For B.A. First Semester

#### **MAJOR COURSES**

Total Marks + % obtained of the subject which the candidate desires to opt for as Major = Total Credit Point. Eligibility of Candidates who aspire for the Major will be determined by this Credit Point.

#### **GENERAL COURSE**

Percentage of Marks in English + % of Marks in MIL /Alt. English + % of Marks in 2nd Elective + % of Marks in 3rd Elective = Total Marks. Total Marks of a candidate in the Merit List will determine his eligibility for the admission.

### 2. How to Apply:

Any student seeking admission to the College in the First Year H.S. or First Semester of B.A. Course must apply in the prescribed form for admission. With the payment of a nominal price it may be collected from the administrative building of the Saraighat College.

The College Admission Committee supervises the Process of Admission.

A candidate must produce his or her Mark-sheet, 2 copies of Passport-size photo, Admit mentioning the Date of Birth or Proof of the same along with Original Certificate related to ST/SC/OBC/MOMC, Migration Certificate (in case of transfer from other University/Council) and Certificate of proficiency in Co-Curricular activities etc. during the time of admission. Photocopies of all the certificates should be attached with the application form.

Students will get admission strictly onthe Merit basis. The College Admission Committee follow strict guideline regarding the policy of reservation for the ST/SC/OBC/MOBC and physically challenged students in consonance with the guideline of the Union Government of India.

Seats are reserved for the students of different categories in the following manner--

SC- 7% ST-5% ST(H)- 5% OBC/MOBC- 15%

Physically Challenged- 2%

Extra Co-Curricular Proficiency- 2%.

### Code of Conduct:

### **Identity Card**

The College Authority issues a Non Transferable Identity Card to each student. The Card containing the photograph of its holder must be endorsed by the Principal, Saraighat College. No Student may be allowed to attend classes without this Identity Card. A student must produce the same whenever the authority wants to see it.

#### Univorms

The College authority does not allow the students to enter in its premises without the prescribed college-uniforms. For boys, it is Black long trouser and Sky-Blue Shirt. Likewise, for the girls, it is Sky Blue Churider (Long Top), Black Long Pajama and a Churni of same colour. Students are expected to wear shoes instead of slippers for their proper maintenance of Dress-code.

#### **Attendance**

Regular attendance in all the classes is compulsory. Students failing to attend 75% of the total classes held will be declared as non collegiate. Likewise, those fails to get 60% attendance will be declared as discollegiate.

### **Examinations**

Apart from the final examinations all the students will have to appear in the four unit tests conducted by the college. It is applicable to both higher secondary and Bachelor of Arts students. Students who donot willfully appear in the unit tests may be penalized by the college.

### College Rules and Regulations

The college lays great emphasis on discipline and character building of the students. They are always expected to maintain discipline. They nust abide by the rules and regulations of the college and the Hostel.

A student if found guilty of misconduct/indiscipline may be be expelled/rusticated for a period/final/debarred from appearing in any examination for one or more years (on the advice of the Disciplinary Committee).

All forms of ragging in the Hostel and college campus are strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be taken against those students who indiidually or collectively get engaged in acts of indiscipline or misbehaviour inside the college campus.

Students must not loiter in pre corridor's in front of the class rooms and office rooms. During their off period students should work quietly in the library or reading room or spend the time without causins any disturbance.

The College Authority will not be responsible for loss of any bike or vehicle in the college campus.

Students are expected to participate in different recreational and co-curricular activities besides the classes. Academic, along with other recreational activities provide new dimensions and opportunities to the students. Therefore, the college authority earnestly seeks their participations in those fields besides the academic one.

Students must not indulge in any unfair means in the examination hall.

They should maintain proper dress code and discard ill parctices like taking alcohol, tobacco, marijuana etc inside the college Campus. Violation of such ethics by any one may invite penalty and even termination of enrollment from the college.

Use of mobile phone inside the college is not allowed. One who brings the same should keep it in silenced mode so that he or she might respond to the urgent calls outside the college campus later on. The College Authority might confiscate mobiles of those who do not obey this insturction and the same would not be returned to the owners.

Damage of any property of the college, quarrel and misbehave towards fellow students, teachers and office staff may invite penalty and termination of enrollment from the college.

Decision of the college authority is final in these regards.


